ALUMNAE FUND UPDATE

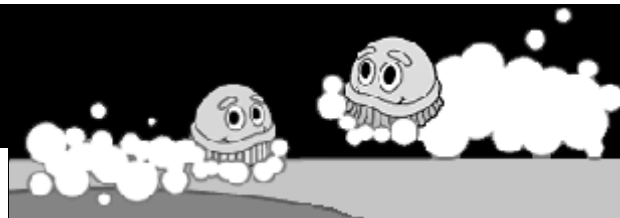

DID YOU KNOW?

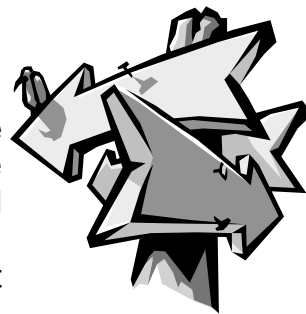

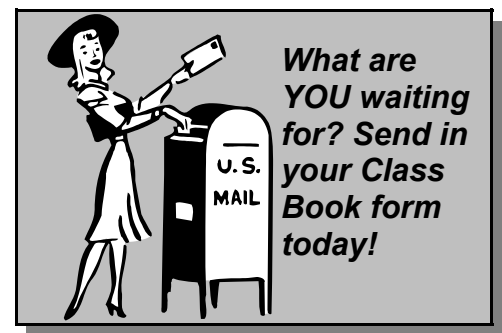
